DIGITAL WELLBEING HOME AGREEMENT

Last week we released a short video (viewable by clicking this link) to explain to parents our approach to supporting your child's Digital Wellbeing in school and some advice on how you can do the same at home. The video divides this into four parts which between them include 12 key suggestions for implementation at home (these were laid out in last week's GW which can be found by clicking here).

The Christmas holiday is usually a period in which technology use increases for a variety of reasons and as such we think it is the perfect time to ask you to either view the video with your child or at least discuss its contents and suggestions and indicate you have done so by completing our <u>Digital Wellbeing Home Agreement which can be accessed here</u>. This is a very quick tick-box form which we hope will give you a useful framework to openly discuss the issues which put at risk your child's healthy relationship with technology.

Ticking 'yes' to any of the statements does not necessarily represent a commitment to doing any of the actions - that is up to you as parents. All we aim to do by laying out these points is to raise awareness of the issues surrounding the Digital Wellbeing of our children in the hope that it will increase the prominence of this as a discussion in all our homes.
